





Possible opportunities from BC Children's Hospital for continued support following a challenging case:

- 1. Virtual Attendance at a Local Debrief: Many sites organize a debrief through WorkSafe BC and/or EFAP. In the past, the PICU team (MD, RN, and sometimes additional staff) has attended these debriefs when our team was involved in the case management. Our team will work around your team's schedule for the debrief. If your team is interested, please contact Anna Weir at anna.weir@cw.bc.ca.
- 2. Attendance at Morbidity & Mortality (M&M) Rounds: In some instances, teams have found it helpful to invite members from the PICU to participate in regional health authority M&M rounds as invited experts.
- 3. Participation in Pediatric Critical Care Learning (PCCL): There is an opportunity to present this case at a future provincial PCCL session. These sessions provide a valuable forum for shared learning across the pediatric critical care community in British Columbia. - 4. **Provincial Safety Review and/or Recommendations**: If the impacts and potential recommendations from this case have provincial applicability, and extend beyond a single site or health authority, there are 2 options.
 - 1. Invite a Provincial Child Health Quality Committee member to a focused recommendation discussion.
 - 2. A provincial review can be conducted under the protection of Section 51, commissioned by the Provincial Child Health Quality Committee, and with representation from all Health Authorities.
